When Poems on Various Subjects, Religious and Moral by Phillis Wheatley was published in 1773, it marked several significant accomplishments. It was the first book by a slave to be published in the Colonies, and only the third book by a woman in the American colonies to be published.

Phillis Wheatley Peters, also spelled Phyllis and Wheatly was the first African-American author of a published book of poetry. Born in West Africa, she was sold into slavery at the age of seven or eight and transported to North America. She was purchased by the Wheatley family of Boston, who taught her to read and write and encouraged her poetry when they saw her talent. On a 1773 trip to London with her master's son, seeking publication of her work, Phillis was aided in meeting ...

Phillis wrote her first poem at the age of 11. She published for the first time by the age of thirteen. Confirmed by scholars, her poem "On Messrs. Hussey and Coffin," was published in the Mercury, a Newport, Rhode Island paper on 21 December 1767. While still expected to do some housework, she was given time to study and write poetry for most of her childhood.
